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## Guest Director's Note

My first impressions of The Song Company, as a relative newcomer to Australia, were of an energetic and engaging group of musicians with a passion for storytelling through the transformative beauty of the human voice. I was struck by their proud history of championing Australian composers and commissioning new works for vocal ensemble. Their joy in experimentation, willingness to embrace new ideas, and the adeptness with which they move between music old and new, is something which has attracted audiences over their almost-40-year history. Even for a company with such a rich legacy, the fact remains that many excellent commissioned works don't get a second performance, and this was at the forefront of my mind when conceiving the program for Songs Under the Southern Cross.

Our program opens with A Vision of Julian of Norwich (of whom more anon), by Australian composer, countertenor and mediaeval harpist, David Yardley. Based on a lifelong love of medieval music, Yardley was inspired by the soaring music of the visions of Hildegard of Bingen (1098-1179) to create musical settings of the words of the medieval English mystic, Mother Julian of Norwich. Yardley's work is both contemporary and ancient, creating a timeless vehicle that elevates Julian of Norwich's poignant words and elegantly sets the scene for Anne Boyd's exploration of 14th century England, and Christian Mysticism.

Mother Julian of Norwich lived in isolation as an anchoress during a pandemic – the bubonic plague, no less. She was enclosed in a cell attached to a church, devoting herself to an ascetic life of prayer and contemplation. Her 'Revelations of Divine Love' are the earliest surviving English Language works by a woman.

Composer Anne Boyd defines her music as "an expression of Christian Love and Buddhist Silence". **Revelations of Divine Love** has a series of contrasting scenes – 'panels', as Boyd describes them. From the opening 'Ma' chords (a reference to Buddhist meditation) which flow seamlessly into the 'Benedicite Domine' section, one could imagine being in a vast cathedral, before Boyd catapults us forward with modern musical language and the drama of the first vision.

Richard Dering (1580-1630) was an English composer who, like a number of Roman Catholic converts, spent most of his professional life in the Netherlands. Factum est silentium in coelo ("There was Silence in Heaven") is a wonderfully descriptive work conjuring up scenes of the war in heaven, as described in the book of Revelation. Listen out for the Archangel Michael who fights the dragon, "draco" in the Latin.

In Ross Edwards' Southern Cross Chants, our focus moves from the Christian mysticism of Julian's visions to the familiar but eternally unfathomable night sky. One of my first projects with The Song Company was a performance of Ross' De Spiritu Sancto. I fell in love with his strikingly energetic approach to vocal writing – joyful, exuberant, and refreshing. In Southern Cross Chants, Edwards explores the rich tapestry of First Nations People's Dreaming alongside Western names of stars and constellations, in a text given to him by friend and astronomer, Fred Watson. The music moves from Edwards' trademark lively passages to moments of sublime contemplation.

In the final work of the program we return to sacred music with J.S. Bach's monumental motet, **Jesu, meine Freude** – a musical language that for some needs no introduction. As well as references to Revalations and "the old dragon," I am particularly struck by the overarching theme of Divine Love and how it is represented in the cross. The author, Johann Franck, compares human affliction with Christ's suffering on Earth, before finally exclaiming in the final stanza:

Denen, die Gott lieben // For those who love God Muss auch ihr Betrüben // even their afflictions Lauter Zucker sein. // become pure sweetness.

All three major works are impressive standalone pieces and, as often in concert programming, juxtaposition invites comparison and the inevitable discussion of thematic links. In this program I invite you to see these three works as if from the vantage point of our familiar and beloved Southern Cross - Crux Australis, and Mirabooka, one of the many First Nations' words for the same sky. In Songs Under the Southern Cross, with substantial works written here, I hope we can feel our strong connection to the soil, sky and rich culture of our land, Australia.

It was exciting to hear that The Song Company was reviving **Revelations of Divine Love**,
a commission dating back some 30 years!

The trip down memory lane has been interesting, even profound, coinciding with the death of close family members.

Grief brings with it thoughts of a possible afterlife and an inevitable re-examination of one's personal spirituality and religious beliefs.

Julian of Norwich's revelations occurred when she, too, was faced with a severe illness and the likely prospect of her mortal death.

She recovered but the 16 visions, 'shewings', she experienced on the 8th May, 1373 were so vivid that she needed to write them down.

Astonishingly, these revelations still speak with meaning to the contemporary mind.

My musical encounter with Julian of Norwich's dramatic and powerful revelations is a deeply felt spiritual exercise, founded upon an overwhelming sense of Love.

I can only hope it will have some similar meaning for today's listeners.

This unforgettable experience was to inspire my choral Fourth Symphony, Star Chant, as Fred had also provided a text linking First Nation Peoples' Dreaming with Western names of stars and constellations.

When Roland Peelman asked me to compose **Southern Cross Chants** for The Song Company, I took up Fred's text once more, this time focusing on words relating to the southern sky.

As I'd anticipated, the wonderful Song Company was undaunted by the challenge in 2004 and I'm so very pleased it will be touring the work again this year.
